A Story about the Verde River and Rancho Tres Brisas.



Since 1963 when my grandfather purchased Rancho Tres Brisas I have been able to experience the beauty of the Verde Valley and our flowing river. My grandfather recognized it as a sustainable asset that would provide beauty, recreation and commerce. He also knew this ribbon of green in Arizona provides special habitat for many creatures along its path. My grandfather saw the power this water had to provide ways for all to enjoy it.

I remember as a child the cathedral like feel of the Verde bottomlands with towering cottonwoods arcing over the river. As a teen I remember the adventure of floating the river to the nearby Mindeleff Caves with its huge nest of daddy long legs! We all dove for the entrance after that discovery! Now, as an adult I recall seeing my first glimpse of a

A Watershed Report Card Conference

On October 28-30 at Cliff Castle Casino in Camp Verde, Friends and the Nature Conservancy, held the second State of the Verde Watershed Conference. Friends and The Nature Conservancy presented draft results from the first ever Verde River Watershed Report Card to about 170 participants representing federal, tribal, state, county, and local agencies, as well as other conservation groups and members of the public. Over two and a half days attendees explored the watershed on guided field trips, provided feedback on report card methods on the topics of flow, habitat, and community, engaged with speakers such as Dr. Bill Dennison, Vice President for Science Application at the University of Maryland, and Lisa Atkins, Arizona State Trust Lands Commissioner, and enjoyed a cool evening by a warm campfire and live music at Jackpot Ranch. You made this conference possible, and we couldn't have done this without our supporters.



river otter, a yellow-billed cuckoo, and other wildlife that call the river corridor home.

In fact my husband and I had one of our first dates up here—I introduced him to the river and the wildness that we call Rancho Tres Brisas.

Fast forward to 2019. My husband and I now live on and own Rancho Tres Brisas. We raise grass and grain-fed tasty critters (BEEF) that live on Tres Brisas all their life. We can only do this because of the river. We are able to irrigate our grass for the beef because of the Verde River. We have worked closely with The Nature Conservancy and the NRCS to ensure we use wise water practices. This winter we are installing sprinkler irrigation that uses less water than flood irrigation. This is important especially in Arizona's summers! We want to be stewards of the river.

We support our Verde River because Arizona needs a green ribbon of life-giving water that serves as a home to cathedral cottonwoods, provides wildlife homes, adventures for individuals, and allows us to produce and provide food for those wanting good Verde Valley grown beef.
